St Teresa of Calcutta

- 1. "Prayer enlarges the heart until it is capable of containing God's gift of Himself."
 - She often taught that prayer is what allows us to receive God's love and share it with others.
- 2. "Prayer is putting yourself in the hands of God, at His disposition, and listening to His voice in the depth of our hearts."
 - For her, prayer was not primarily talking, but listening.

- 3. "The fruit of silence is prayer. The fruit of prayer is faith. The fruit of faith is love. The fruit of love is service. The fruit of service is peace."
- 4. "If you pray, you will have faith; if you have faith, you will love; if you love, you will serve."
- 5. "Prayer makes your heart bigger, until it is capable of containing God's gift of Himself."
- 6. "We need to find God, and He cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence."
- 7. "I always begin my prayer in silence, for it is in the silence of the heart that God speaks."
 - Prayer is daily bread. She believed prayer was not optional for a Christian; it was as necessary as breathing.
 - Prayer leads to action. For her, prayer and service to the poorest of the poor were inseparable.
 - Prayer begins with listening. She often said that most people think prayer is speaking, but real prayer begins when we listen to God.
 - Prayer is simple. She taught that prayer does not need big words: "Just say, 'Here I am, Lord."
